- 2.6 Innovative processes adopted by the institution in Teaching and Learning:
 - Creating high interest through sharing real life cases, showing movie clips related to the subject, visual charts and collage presentations, conducting quiz and management games resulting into high student engagement, clarity on the subject and active participation.
 - Students are encouraged to prepare models and model competition is organized to develop their creativity, planning, execution skills, presentation skills, communication skills and team work.
 - Movie reviews, book reviews, budget discussions, project based learning etc. help students to get holistic view of the subject.
 - Faculty uses audio visual aids in the class along with chalk and talk method which helps students to get good hold on the subject and improves their imagination and listening skills. E learning sessions were used in remedial sessions in Mathematical and Statistical techniques.
 - Faculty also share their knowledge through mock stock and simulation games that
 enriches the classroom learning and creates deeper impact on the understanding of the
 concepts.
 - Highly qualified faculty with corporate / industry experience bring the fresh knowledge and share real life examples to enable students to understand the application of knowledge. Guest lectures are organized related to subject and other useful areas.
 - Learning is not just restricted to the classroom environment and field trips to institutions like NSC, SEBI, RBI etc. and industrial visits to the companies / industries are organized to enhance the learning experience.
 - Simulation and role play techniques are used to create higher understanding concepts and applications in subjects like Marketing, Consumer Behavior, Human Recourses, Principles of Management, Business Communication, Organizational Behaviour etc.
