



ACTIVITY 7: BE A LIFE SAVER - DEMONSTRATION OF LIFE SAVING TECHNIQUES

Event: Be a life saver Date: 08 August 2021

It was a collaboration project organized by Rotaract Club of Mumbai Wadala East

Where they had ask for collaboration and the requirement was minimum of ten participant's requirement for the collaboration. It was carried out via zoom. And the guest speaker was Rotarian Akshay Mehta and also the session was interactive and we were free to ask our queries.

Impact Analysis of the Project:

Cardiopulmonary resuscitation, more commonly known as CPR, is a life-saving technique that helps maintain blood and oxygen flowing and dramatically increases the chances of survival in those who suffer a cardiac arrest. We had a total participation of 238 .These many number of people now know how to perform a CPR and use an AED machine. If in future, they have to face such an unfortunate situation they will know how to react to it and save that person's life. The participants were very interactive and they were keen to share the knowledge of CPR with as many people as possible.

Why was the project carried out?

The main idea behind this project was to teach people the importance of knowing how to perform CPR and AED. We also wanted people to know the difference between heart attack and cardiac arrest as most people don't know the difference between the two and think it's the same thing. The idea came through when we read about what happened to Christian Eriksen, a Danish professional footballer. He collapsed on the field while playing football against Finland in euros 2020 and his captain Simon Kjaer, turned him on his right side as he knew what was happening, this action must've just saved Eriksen's life as he was going through a cardiac arrest. Soon the medics got on the field and performed CPR. Eriken's heart started beating again after one shock from the defibrillator. This got us thinking about the importance of knowing how to perform CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation) and AED (shock machine) and how so many people could've been saved if everyone knew how to react in a similar situation


What was the ground work / pre-work done before the actual execution of the event? :-

The marketing of this event was done on three social media platforms: Instagram, Facebook and WhatsApp. A series of post and interactive stories were given to the collaborating clubs to be posted on the social media in order to raise maximum awareness of this event. The interactive stories held questions and quizzes related to CPR, cardiac arrest and the heart.

There was constant communication and coordination between us and the person of contact of the collaborating clubs. We had also organized a small zoom practice session to understand the flow of the event 15 to 30 minutes before the actual event. Social media marketing in our own Instagram account was done through a nine grade post. Our speakers were Rtn. Dr. Akshay Mehta, a well-known international cardiologist and a team of three people from I-care team of holy family hospital who taught us how to perform CPR by performing it on a dummy for a better understanding. They also showed us how to use the AED machine with help various videos and pictures.



Dr. Harini C, the chairperson of WDC and the convener for this webinar commenced the session by welcoming Ms. Nisha and introducing her to the attendees.






What was the pre-work done?





guest speaker. Riya Shukla, a SYBSCIT student delivered a formal vote of thanks which



After analyzing responses on personal chats and feedbacks from different states and countries that we received after the session, the event was very informative, interactive, and for all the participants.



<u>Date & Time:</u> Saturday, 29th January, 2022; 3 pm- 4:30 pm.





The event ended with a warm Vote of Thanks given by Ms. Fleur Fernandes, the Chairperson of



The BFM Department of SIES College of Commerce and Economics Autonomous, organized a session on 'Deciphering Budget 2022' as a part of the FINOVA Fest, on 2nd March, 2022, between 11 am and 1:30 pm. Dr. Rita Shah, Dr. Pruthviraj Desai, Mr. Natrajan Pillai, Mr. Prithipal Singh were invited to have a 90-minute discussion, focusing on the various aspects of the budget presented by the Finance Minister of India Ms. Nirmala Sitharaman.

The session witnessed participation of approximately 86 students (online and offline), the Principal, Vice Principals, 3 faculties and students from various courses such as BCOM, BFM, BMS, BAF, BBI and even BSCIT attended this session. The overwhelming response by the students in order to attend this session was not overlooked by anyone.

The panellists arrived on time and had a small discussion with the Principal as to which areas needed to be targeted and what would the flow of events will be. They were then escorted to the auditorium by the hosts. The event commenced with lighting of the lamp and a devotional song of Lord Ganesha sung by Harshini Satish Kumar from FYBAF and Yagnesh Jetwa from FYJC. The Principal then addressed the audience. Mr. Natrajan pointed out that the budget has focused on the farmers also by providing them with incentives and facilities. The panellists provided insights and tips throughout, one of which was that students should preferably open a Demat accounts while taking admission and invest a sum of money monthly to learn about the markets on their own. Dr. Rita noted that the impact of this budget is going to be better infrastructure and more job opportunities. She also spoke about how the budget has recognized digital assets for the first time in India.

The panellists then entertained questions arising in audiences' minds in order to get their concepts clear. The question-and-answer round was very interesting as it allowed the students an opportunity to interact with the panellists and share their views and queries.

Dr Mukti Patel, the guest speaker, covered various aspects of leadership skills through a


PowerPoint presentation. At the end of the seminar Principal Ma'am highlighted some real-life

towards the judge, Mr. Swarn Singh. Sheetal Uppalwar delivered formal Vote of Thanks which







participants received participation certificates. A vote of thanks brought Nostrum to an end. The


programme was quite educational, with a variety of fresh topics that piqued everyone's interest

Once the introduction was done, the 3 topics were introduced. The rules and regulations were conveyed once more and the competition began.









Date & time- 14th January 2022, 11:30 am to 12:30 pm


