

#### Minutes of the IQAC meeting on 30.08.2021

The IQAC meeting was held on 30<sup>th</sup> august, 2021 to discuss the perspective plan for executing Autonomy for next two years and quality enhancement policy for current the academic year. The following points were discussed and agreed upon :

#### Review of students' feedback on teaching

Principal Dr. Nina Roy Choudhury informed that students' feedback on teaching collected last year have been analysed, shared and discussed with teachers individually. She expressed her satisfaction that feedback for all the full time teachers is good ,however teachers should strive for continuous improvement and explore and implement the innovative and effective teaching tools.

#### **ERP** System :

• Principal Dr. Nina Roy Choudhury drew the attention that we had successfully implemented our specialized ERP system for admissions and examinations last academic year and the same will be used for all academic and Administrative activities in the current academic year also and it is mandatory for all the faculty inhouse as well as visiting to use the system.

# Bridge Course / Remedial Coaching / Intensive Coaching

Ms. Sangeeta Kore expressed that every department should conduct bridge course . Technicalities of these courses were discussed and decided that

- Bridge course should be of minimum 30hrs duration
- Selection criteria for the course can be either XII std. marks or an on line test to understand the level of the student
- It should be conducted within two three weeks after commencement of first year lectures

Remedial lectures/ assignment/ meeting should be organized before semester end examination for failures in Internal Examination

CA Chandrashekhar Sawant suggested that BAF department will work on Intensive Coaching as the cut off for first year admissions for BAF was quite high.



## Minutes of the IQAC meeting on 30.10.2021

The IQAC meeting was held on 30<sup>th</sup> October, 2021 to discuss the plan for conducting college activities in blended teaching learning environment and quality enhancement policy for the current academic year.

The meeting started with the welcome address by Principal, Dr. Nina Roy Choudhury. She shared a good news that the college has received confirmation from NAAC that the accreditation validity is extended for 5 years is upto  $31^{st}$  December, 2025 and added that we should take this as opportunity to improve our score from A Grade to A+ Grade.

Ms. Sangeeta Kore, IQAC co-ordinator explained that our new accreditation cycle has begun from academic year 2020-21, the year in which college was conferred autonomy. She also brought to the notice of the members that AQAR / SSR guidelines for autonomous colleges are different and more rigorous compared to non autonomous colleges, emphasizing on curriculum development, quality of teaching learning, research and collaboration with other stake holders of higher education. This calls for a systematic plan for quality evaluation, promotion and sustenance.

The following points were discussed and agreed upon :

## Preparation for phase wise re-opening of the college

Principal Madam informed that we have begun physical classes of junior college from 4<sup>th</sup> October and degree college from 20<sup>th</sup> October, 2021 as the government has directed phase wise reopening of the colleges.

As per the Government mandate, only fully vaccinated students and staff are allowed to enter the college premises. We have collected data through Google form about the vaccination status of students and their willingness to attend off-line lectures.

It is indicated that SSC and HSC examinations are likely to be off-line. We can expect TY examinations also to be off-line and hence in the second semester we will begin with PG, TY lectures and B.Sc (IT) /M.Sc(IT) practical classes. FY / SY off-line lectures will also be started depending on then prevailing Covid scenario and government directives. She further assured that all lectures , co-curricular / extra- curricular activities / NAAC work will be done as per the time-line, however , the methodology may differ.

# Parameters for Students' Satisfaction Survey

Ms. Sangeeta Kore explained that Student Satisfaction Survey is NAAC mandate which collects the data about students perception / satisfaction level about various facilities rendered by the college. She proposed the parameters for the survey in various categories such as Teaching , Learning and Evaluation , Holistic development, Counseling & Support Service ,College Office , Library Support during Pandemic. She also added that the parameters in the survey are modified to suit on-line teaching learning during pandemic , however few more parameters will be added to evaluate blended learning



pattern. She informed that we also take feedback on Teaching, Learning and Evaluation to understand its efficacy. The members were requested to give their suggestions on the Parameters of SSS.

Student representative Anjali Mandal requested for using college website as mode of communication for Placements and Internships.

Ms. Shailashri , Placement incharge explained that we nominate student co-ordinators and have separate WhatsApp group for Placements and Internships. Teachers communicate with student co-ordinators & student co-ordinators reach out to all concerned students. Principal madam informed that college website has designated tab for Placements and Internships and we need to use it optimally. She also suggested to hold a meeting of teacher co-ordinators , student co-ordinators and student representatives at IQAC and CDC to arrive at better networking for Placements and Internships.

## Review of admission and examination process through JUNO

Ms. Charul Patel, Controller of Examination expressed satisfaction that examination and result processing through JUNO is quite streamlined & customized to our needs as compared to last year.

Principal madam informed that as a part of preparations for autonomy in 2019-20, we have successfully implemented in-house result processing. In 2020-21 we have adopted new ERP system JUNO. Lot of brain storming was done and painstaking efforts were taken to improvise the system as per our needs and university norms. She proudly stated that during pandemic we successfully implemented on-line proctoring and result generation for the all the examinations.

However, for college admissions 2021-22, JUNO ERP system did not live up to the expectations. In spite of that we could meet all challenges of generating merit lists, payment module and generating fee receipts within university deadlines due to the creative solutions worked out by our admission team.

## Teachers / student exchange program

Ms. Sangeeta Kore informed that last year faculty exchange program was implemented by B.Com Financial Markets and M.Sc (IT) in association with SIES College of Arts , Science Commerce, Nerul, She requested that it should be implemented by all the departments this year. We can tie up with our sister institutions or other autonomous institutions where our teachers are members of BOS. Principal madam suggested that even though college reopens physically , faculty exchange program can be conducted in on-line mode to avail flexibility in the timetable and to avoid travelling time for teachers.



## AQAR submission

Ms. Sangeeta Kore informed that AQAR is compilation of factual reports for assessment of various accreditation criteria and as per the revised format we need to upload documents supporting the given information, hence we need to strengthen our skills of systematic data organization.

She also emphasized that every supporting document must be as per the format given , with College name as header duly signed by the teacher in-charge , HOD / Principal /

Vice Principal / IQAC Co-ordinator.

Ms. Sangeeta Kore assured that the follow up with JUNO team will be done and flow chart for the same will be shared with teachers or training session for the same will be organized at the earliest.

#### Minutes of the IQAC meeting on 27.04.2022

The IQAC meeting was held on 27<sup>th</sup> April, 2022 to discuss and take review of the activities conducted in 2021-22 and plan for the activities to be conducted in 2022-23.

The meeting started with the welcome address by Principal, Dr. Nina Roy Choudhury.

The following points were discussed and agreed upon:

Ms. Sangeeta Kore, IQAC co-ordinator explained and stressed that a lot of work in Curriculum design and development needs to be done in the AY 2022-23.

She informed that an FDP was planned in association with MOP Vaishnav College for the current AY. But it has been now been postponed to the next AY 2022-23. It will be conducted once the college reopens.

Thereafter a review of the Value added courses and Students Development programs conducted during the current year and the proposed ones was undertaken.


During the discussion on Internships and Projects Ms. Sangeeta Kore, IQAC co-ordinator emphasized that it is necessary to strengthen this aspect and projects should be carried out in collaboration with institutions. Dr. Seethalekshmy suggested we can collaborate with TISS for Student Projects and Student Development Programs.

With regards to Placements and Internships, it was pointed out that it is necessary to train students in communication and other aspects for improving their Employability skills and overall personality.

In further discussion, it was decided to consider Articleship / Internship / working in Own Business for benefit for Internal marks - 1 month or 100 hours duration be awarded 10 marks for Report & Certificate submitted and 10 marks for Viva. She also informed that under the subject of Foundation Course - FC projects with NGO certificate for FY & SY SEM 2 and 4 should be restarted from next AY as physical classes would begin. Total 20 marks can be allotted for it i.e. 10 marks for working and certificate and 10 marks for viva.

Ms. Sangeeta Kore requested that faculty exchange program should be implemented by all the departments with other than S.I.E.S. institutions. It was discussed and decided that even though college reopens physically, faculty exchange program can be conducted in on-line mode or offline mode as per convenience of teachers to avail flexibility in the timetable and to plan travelling time.

She informed that in the beginning of AY 2022-23 common test at entry level to be conducted across the courses, which will help to formulate Bridge / Remedial courses for slow learners by all departments and Advance course by BAF department. Bridge courses should be conducted within 10 days of commencement of the AY / semester and Feedback and Test must be taken upon completion.



Ms. Sangeeta Kore suggested that a Demo of different ICT used by teachers would be organized to have share different ideas and techniques.

She also informed that mentoring to be continued in Online or Offline mode as per the convenience of the teachers and in online mode, parents too be involved.

Ms. Sangeeta Kore informed that CO PO mapping for Sem 1 to 4 has been already done in this AY and for Sem 5 and 6, it should be done in the next AY. Also training on Calculation of attainment of the objective will be undertaken AY year 2022-23.

She also informed that more emphasis would be given to promotion of research work and there would be an increase in budget for the same. More activities and workshops would also be conducted for the same in the next AY 2022-23.

Ms. Sangeeta Kore also emphasized need for Innovation Ecosystem and business incubation and that a lot of work needs to be done in this area. Dr. Shanti Suresh suggested that students to be given seed money to undertake small business activity at college level to experience business ecosystem.

The need to strengthen Extension Activities was emphasized by especially at Gothegar village by NSS and all departments Each and every department would be required to conduct some kind of extension activity other than Gothegar village.

Principal Madam informed that there would be infrastructure upgradation gradually with improvement and extension of Wifi facility, plagiarism software, computer labs updation and purchase of new laptops for teachers.

Ms. Sangeeta Kore also emphasized need for conducting Activities/Programs which would be in line with Capacity Building and Skill Development as specified by NAAC and ensure that such activities should have maximum students' participation.

Various training programs were reviewed and the plan for next year was discussed.

Everyone was informed about the audits conducted in the current year along with the recommendations.

The meeting ended with the vote of thanks.
